





Excerpt from "Coppelia"

Synopsis

In a small village there is a lonely alchemist named Dr. Coppelius, who has created several human-sized dolls to express her artistry and keep herself company. Her most precious doll, Coppelia, was made with the purpose of being brought to life to become her main companion. The Doctor keeps the beautiful Coppelia doll on her balcony, overlooking the village square. It is there that the doll has caught the eye of young Frantz, who thinks her to be real, and becomes smitten. Frantz' sweetheart, Swanilda, is determined to invesitgate and confront Coppelia and so breaks into Dr. Coppelius' shop with her friends. And this is where we enter the story.

Swanilda and her friends find Coppelia and make the discovery that she is in fact a doll and not real, after which they decide to turn on all of the Doctor's dolls for fun. As they enjoy reeking havoc in the Doctor's workshop, she returns and chases them out... all except Swanilda who hides behind Coppelia and has the grand plan to switch places with the doll. While the Doctor consults her spell book, Frantz also sneaks in to the workshop to search for Coppelia. Upon discovering the newest intruder, Dr. Coppelius conceives the idea to use Frantz's spirit to bring Coppelia to life. She puts Frantz to sleep with a potion and brings out what she thinks is her beloved Coppelia, but is now Swanilda in disguise. Swanilda plays along, and when the Doctor awakens Frantz, she convinces Frantz to play along as well. After the three dance together, the village horns announce the start of the annual Harvest festival, and the two sweethearts escape the workshop, turning on all of Dr. Coppelius' dolls one last time as a distraction.



These young dancers seek to educate and inspire audiences throughout the Maryland and D.C. region by performing in various venues throughout the year, beyond the semi-annual performances. HGCBT, a registered 501(c)(3), strives to present performances that are exciting and inspiring for both the dancers and audience. Fulfilling these goals becomes easier as our dancers build confidence while becoming more accomplished.

Regionally, Miss Claire has also performed with Deep Vision Dance in Baltimore, ClancyWorks Dance Company in Washington, DC, Other Voices Theatre in Frederick, and at Olney Theatre Center. She has assistant directed, choreographed, and taught for Red Branch Theatre, Round House Theatre Education, and with Poolesville High School's Drama Department.

Whilst deeply versed in classical ballet, Miss Claire has studied tap, contemporary, modern, stage management, and lighting, earning a degree in dance with a minor in theater from the University of MD, Baltimore County. She has been teaching all age groups for 15 years at multiple studios in Columbia, Germantown, Silver Spring, and Frederick. She taught for HGBA from the time she was 15, including summer ballet camps.

Kiyon Gaines Ross, Lucy Bowen-McCauley, and Ilana Goldman, as well as roles across the classical repertoire. He has also been a contributing writer to the DC Dance Journalism Project. Mr. Justin currently dances with Dana Tai Soon Burgess Dance Company.
